- 48 A.L. Anderson Park, 39699 US Hwy. 19 N., between Klosterman Rd. and Tarpon Ave., Tarpon Springs (7am - dusk)
- 49 Bank of America, 10900 Seminole Blvd., between 102nd Ave. and 110th Ave., Seminole
- 50 Brooker Creek Education Center (look for a sign just before the main parking lot), 3940 Keystone Rd., Tarpon Springs (Thu. - Sun. 7am - one hour before dusk)
- 51 Curlew Retention Pond, 1825 Curlew Rd., between Belcher Rd. and CR 1, Dunedin
- 52 John Chesnut Sr. Park, southwest corner of Sandy Point Rd. and East Lake Rd., north of the park entrance, Palm Harbor (7am - dusk)
- 54 Lake Seminole Park, 10015 Park Blvd., east of Seminole Blvd., Seminole
- 55 North County Service Center, 29582 US Hwy. 19 N., between Curlew Rd. and SR 580, Dunedin
- 56 Hamlin Boulevard, 14644 113th Ave. N., enter off the west side of Hamlin Blvd., south of 113th Ave. N. in parking lot of 4H Club, Largo
- 57 Pinellas County Extension, 12520 Ulmerton Rd., just north of the Ulmerton entrance on the 125th St. N. frontage road, Largo
- 58 Pinellas County Solid Waste, 109th Ave. N. and 28th St., St. Petersburg *
- 59 Sand Key Park, 1060 Gulf Blvd., Clearwater Beach (7am - dusk)
- 60 William E. Dunn Water Reclamation Facility, 4111 Dunn Dr., off Alt. 19, 2 miles south of Klosterman Rd., Palm Harbor

- 65 Walmart, 23106 U.S. Hwy. 19 N. at NW intersection with Coachman Road (look for containers at SE corner of parking lot).
- 66 Fort De Soto Park, 3500 Pinellas Bayway S., Tierra Verde (overflow parking lot for the boat ramp area).



RECYCLING GUIDELINES

No plastic bags please!

- Aluminum Cans** – Empty aluminum cans used for drinks or food. Rinse and crush if possible.
- Cardboard** – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. Pizza boxes okay if no food or grease. If the bottom is greasy, tear it off and recycle the clean lid only.
- Cartons** – Empty gable-top beverage containers such as milk, half and half or orange juice cartons. Rinse and crush if possible. No straws.
- Cooking Oil** – Used liquid cooking oil (such as oil from a turkey fryer). No solids or motor oil.
- Glass** – Empty glass bottles or jars (all colors). Labels okay.
- Mixed Paper** – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper, or paperboard items such as cereal boxes. No paper towels or tissues.
- Newspapers** – Clean and dry newspapers (including inserts). No string, twine or plastic bags. It's okay to put the newspapers inside a paper bag.
- Plastics #1-7** – Plastic bottles or containers marked with a recycling triangle and a number. Must be empty. Examples: soda bottle, milk jug, shampoo bottle, yogurt cup, margarine tub or deli container. Rinse and crush if possible. Labels okay. Caps okay but remove the cap from the bottle so that liquids dry out. Place the cap and the bottle in the bin. No bags, Styrofoam or items without a recycling triangle (such as straws).
- Steel (Tin) Cans** – Empty steel cans used for food such as soup cans. Labels and lids okay. No paint cans. Empty aerosol cans okay.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING OPTIONS (for single family homes)

- If you live near a city, contact that city to request curbside recycling.
- Contact the company that provides your waste collection to request curbside recycling. All companies providing waste collection in unincorporated Pinellas County to residences of four units or less are required to be licensed and provide recycling services (may charge a fee).

The following companies agreed to be listed, with the understanding that a listing does not guarantee service. Some companies only provide service for communities. There may be an extra charge for recycling services, and items collected may vary.
